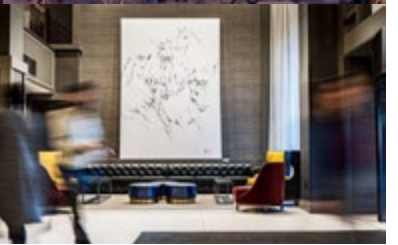

Emma Chandler, General Manager of Barrels & Billets, associated with the Louisville Slugger Museum & Factory, will provide an interesting and enjoyable presentation.



The name 'Barrels & Billets' is a nod to Hillerich & Bradsby Co.'s history and connection with wood. That connection goes back more than a century and a half, when J. Frederick Hillerich immigrated to America from Germany on October 7, 1842 and eventually moved to Louisville. Once there, he opened his own wood shop. At the time, part of his business included barrel

making for the growing Bourbon industry. In 1884, the family company jumped into the baseball bat business. "Billets" refers to the thick, cylindrical pieces of wood that are used at Louisville Slugger Museum & Factory to make baseball bats. Source: Our Story - Barrels & Billets (barrelsandbillets.com)

Emma will open up with a bit of information on what the Barrels & Billets experience entails, and then will dive into the journey of developing Barrels & Billets, and what it was like to be a part of opening up a new business. Her presentation will have a heavy focus on the teamwork that was required, challenges she and the team had to overcome, Emma's personal career development, and what has been learned since they opened their doors to the public.

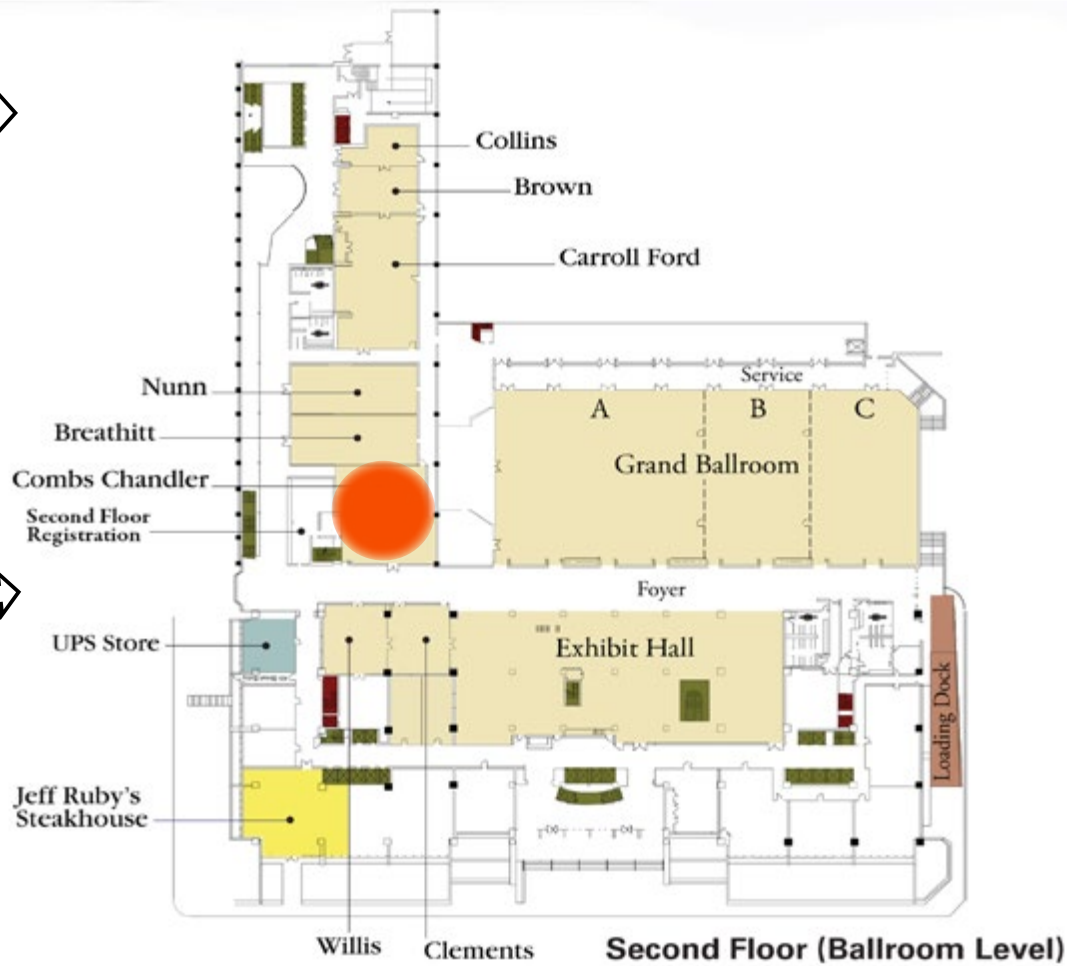

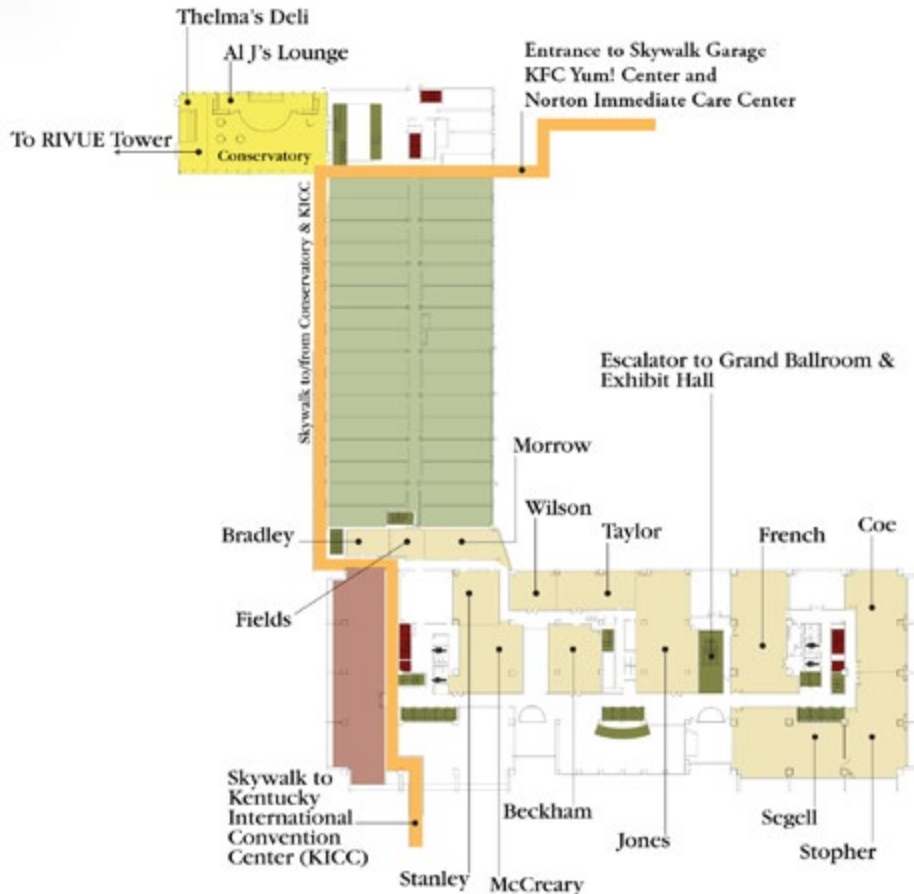

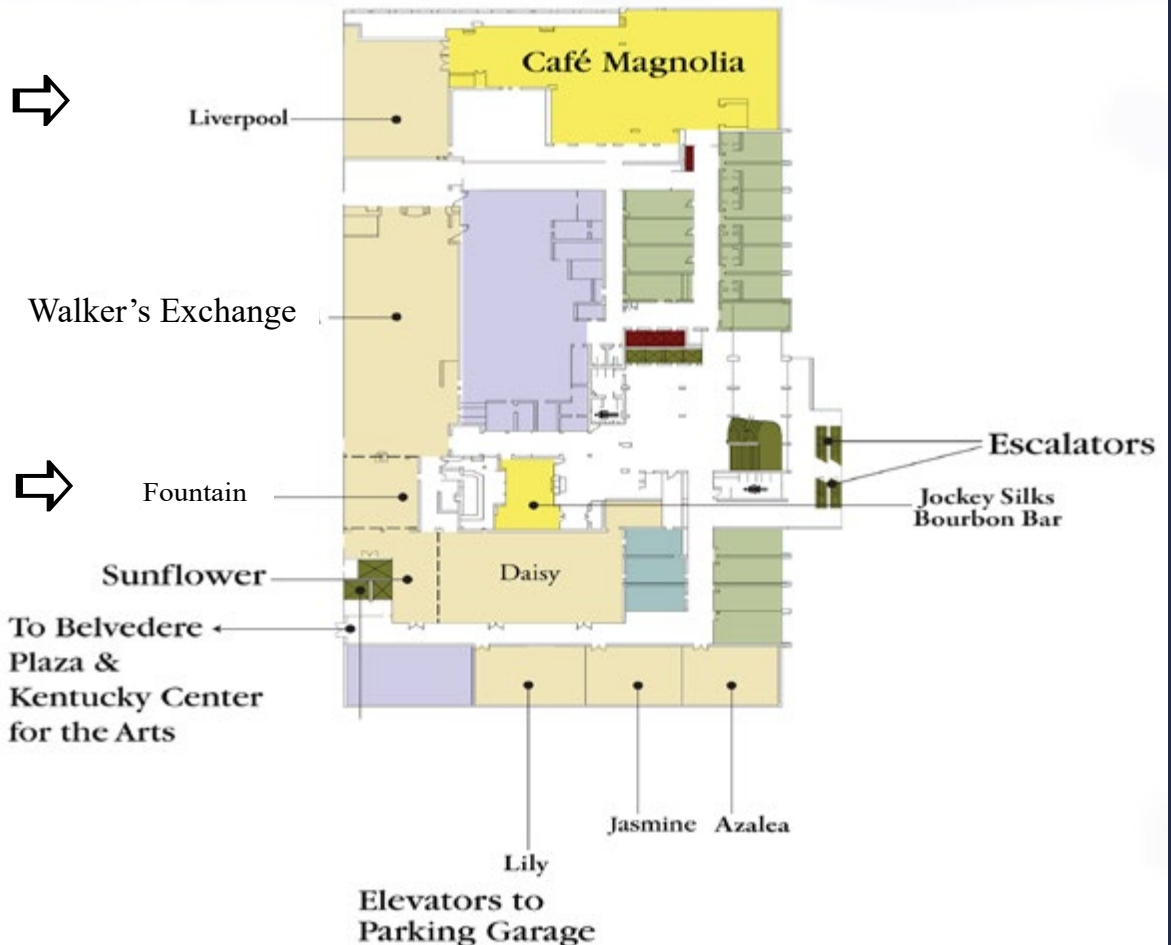

“Bisphosphonates, Osteonecrosis of the Jaws (ONJ) and Dentistry - Where Are We Now and What Do We Know?”

There has been a new pathologic entity which was identified in the literature in 2003. Patients were found to have painful exposed bony areas of the jaws which occurred after simple dental procedures such as extractions. There were also reports of spontaneous exposures of bone in the jaws which were symptomatic. The common link was to the drug class of bisphosphonates. Bisphosphonates were given intravenously to cancer patients to combat the hypercalcemia often seen in multiple myeloma and metastatic cancers. This new condition was named osteonecrosis of the jaws (ONJ).

There are also oral forms of bisphosphonate drugs such as Fosamax, Actonel and Boniva. Although there is a higher incidence of osteonecrosis associated with IV administration of bisphosphonates, we have seen cases of ONJ associated with oral bisphosphonates that were prescribed to treat osteoporosis.

The lecture will review what we currently know about bisphosphonates, including recommendations for dental management and prevention of ONJ. We will also discuss what is uncertain at this early stage of the new pathologic entity.

Dr. Shelburne went to prison on August 20, 2008 and was released on May 14, 2010 and learned a series of lessons the hard way. There are ways to protect and defend a dental practice and to prevent what happened to him from happening to you. You can protect your practice in the event of a Board complaint, insurance audit, malpractice claim, or criminal complaint and maximize legitimate reimbursement.

Dr. Shelburne found that his records and systems were faulty. He learned that it is critical and possible to implement protocols and form a defensive systemic approach to record keeping. Know that if it's not in your clinical record, you didn't see it, you didn't say it, you didn't do it, it didn't need to be done, and it doesn't exist...from the legal perspective. To be prepared for any challenge, the whole dental team must be careful, concise, complete, and diligent, not just the doctor. Learning and implementing this no non-sense team approach to record keeping could mean the difference between success and failure in the event of an action or challenge to your practice and will result in maximum legitimate reimbursement.

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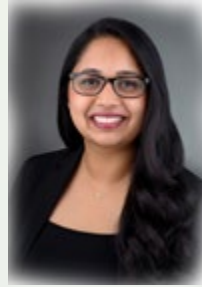
