Dental Lifeline Network • Kentucky **Program Highlights**

Dental Lifeline Network is grateful for the Kentucky Dental Association's partnership in developing a Donated Dental Services (DDS) program in 2015 to help people with disabilities of who are elderly or medically fragile and have no other access to dental care, and KDA's continued support.

The Story

The DDS program helps people like Cassie, 38, a single mom who lives in Green County. Cassie suffers from Crohn's disease, rheumatoid arthritis, fibromyalgia, and kidney stones. In 2020, she battled breast cancer, undergoing chemotherapy and a full mastectomy. She has also had her gallbladder removed and undergone two colon resections. Unfortunately, Cassie's medical challenges have negatively impacted her dental health and made it difficult to get the nutrition she needs to stay healthy. Her medications contributed to dry mouth and she had multiple decayed teeth that caused constant pain. Unable to work, Cassie and her son survive on Social Security Disability insurance and a small amount of child support. With the help of family, they just barely make ends meet each month, with nothing left over for dental treatment.

This changed when a team of DDS volunteer dentists and labs stepped in to help. An endodontist provided a root canal treatment and a general dentist restored a decayed tooth, and with the help of a volunteer laboratory, donated a crown. Thanks to these caring volunteers, Cassie received thousands in donated treatment that relieved her pain and restored her dental health! She shared her sincere appreciation for this amazing gift:

The Kentucky DDS program is part of a network in which services are available in all 50 states. DLN volunteers provided nearly \$18 million in donated treatment nationwide in fiscal year 2022-2023.


